Roberts Field Parking Lot Traffic Study

- **CPD Parking Lot Traffic Study** conducted as part of 2017 Roberts Field Master Plan
 - The Chelmsford Police Department counted vehicles driving into parking lot from Old Westford Road using a road tube unit on the following dates
 - August 7 - 14, 2017 (before new playground)
 - August 23 - 29, 2019
- Existing parking lot spaces – 98
 - Includes upper and lower parking lots and 3 handicap spaces (lower parking lot)
 - Master Plan proposed increasing parking spaces (113) with new painted lines (vertical orientation) and parking extension
 - Master Plan also included landbank of 4 additional spaces in lower parking lot near Engine 3 (TBD)
- DPW Assistant Director Steve Jahnle 10/24/19 update:
 - I'm not adding any additional pavement, just restriping the lot. The top will be angled and one way like it is now. It will have 2 handicap spots up top and 2 below. Also, up top will have 2 spots for the electric car charging station, assuming the grant comes thru. Should end up with right around that 98 spaces when done.

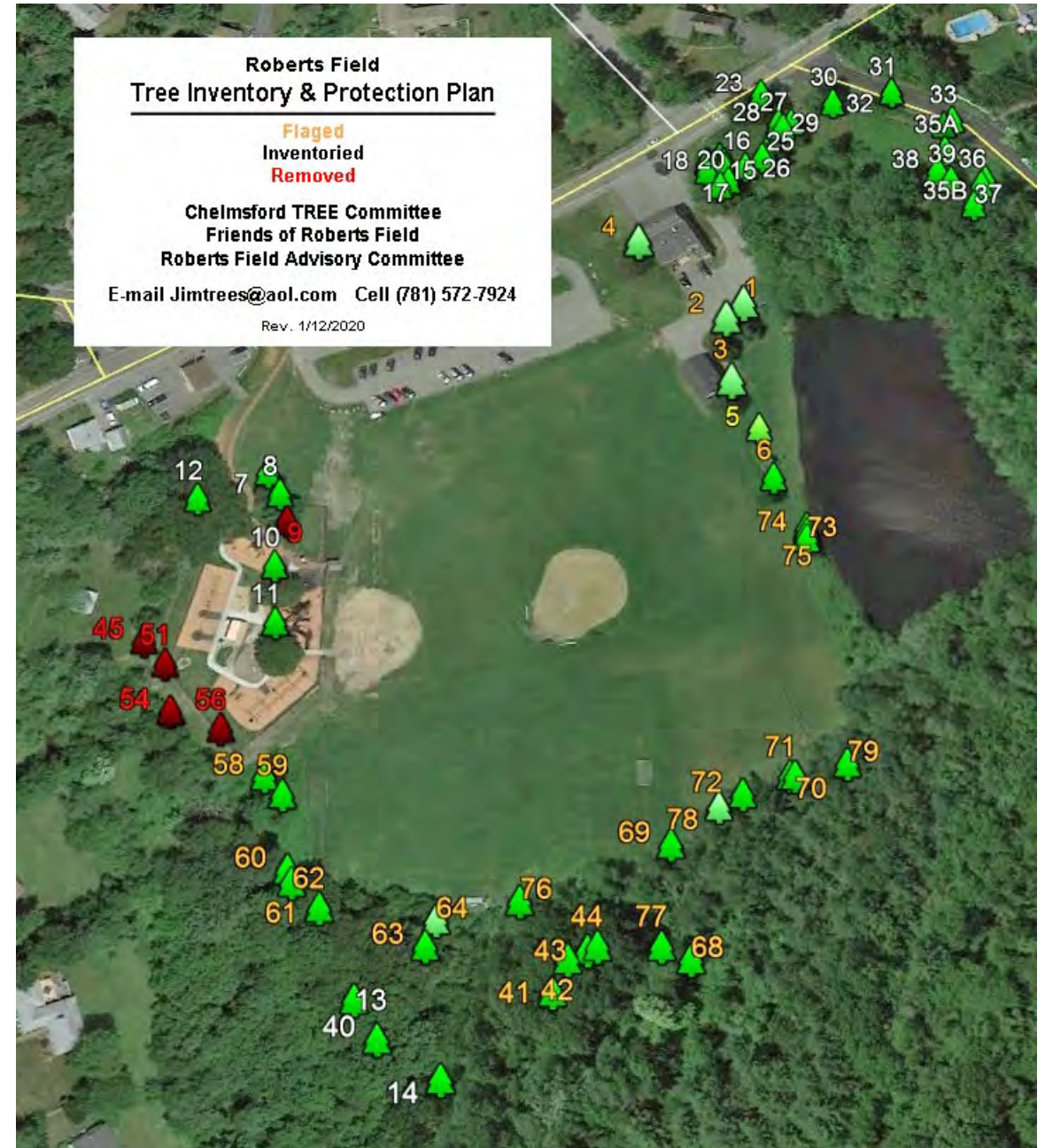
Traffic Study: Future Parking Lot Demand

- FY21 planned opening of new ballfields creates new parking lot demand
 - Two baseball fields (Stakeholder: CYBA – U12, March-October)
 - Weeknight practices and Saturday games requiring estimated 40 parking spaces each
 - Multi-sport lacrosse striped field (Stakeholder: CYLA, Spring-Summer)
 - 5-6 games or practices per week requiring 50-60 parking spaces each
 - CYBA and CYLA coordinate game and practice schedules
- Existing parking space inventory (98) may accommodate new demand with exceptions during busy periods
 - Existing Saturday traffic is an average of 29 (high of 44)
 - Existing weeknight traffic is an average of 23 (high of 52)

Projects Update

- DPW Current Timeline/Action Plan:

FORF Fundraising Update

- Friends of Roberts Field
 - Fundraising ended October 2019
 - Provided nearly a third of total playground project value
 - 42 playground sponsorships
 - 941 bricks sold
- \$90k paid to the Town
 - Approximately \$30k to be used for debt service of CPA bond at Spring Town Meeting
- Plus \$50k in FY20 State funds for Phase 2 improvements

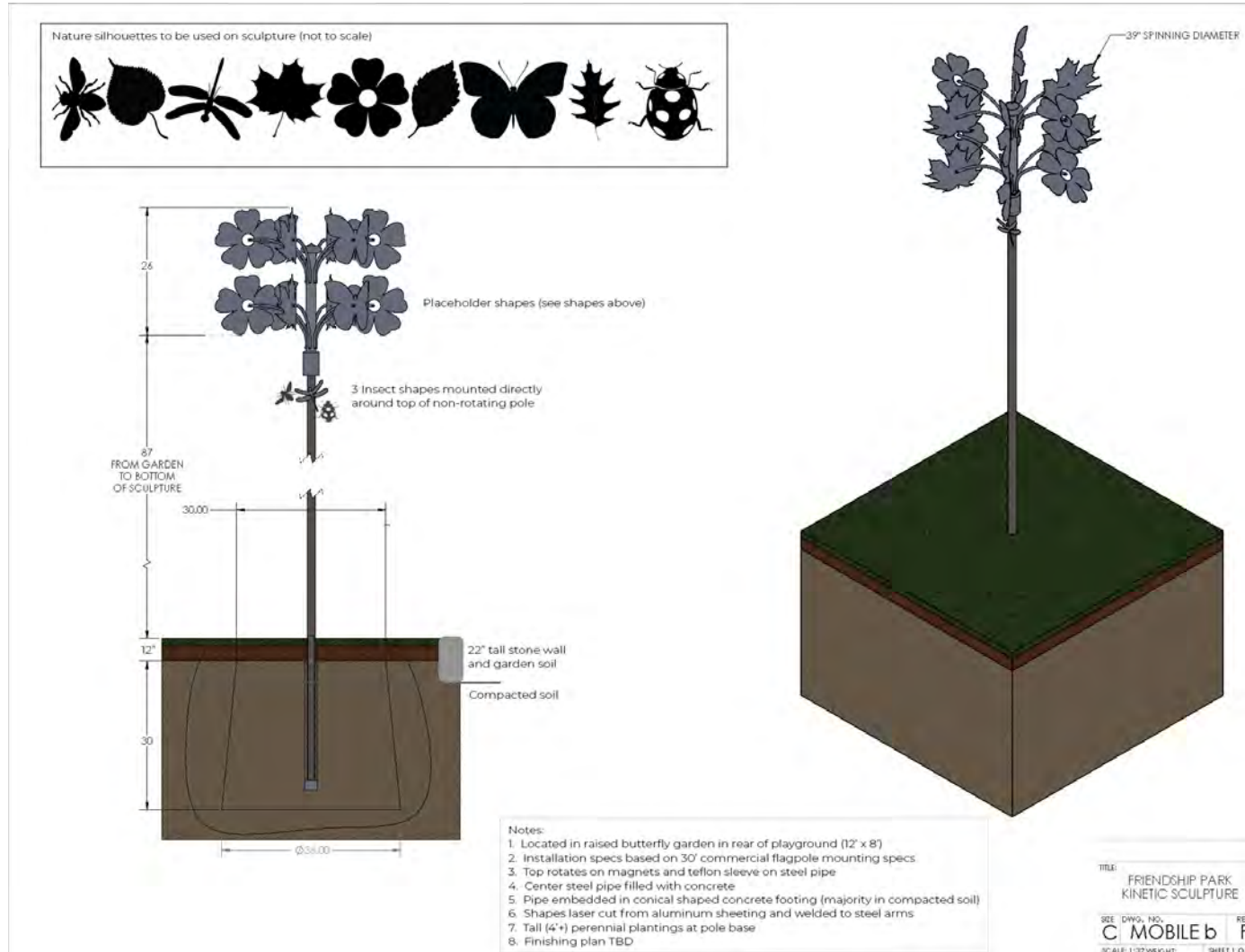

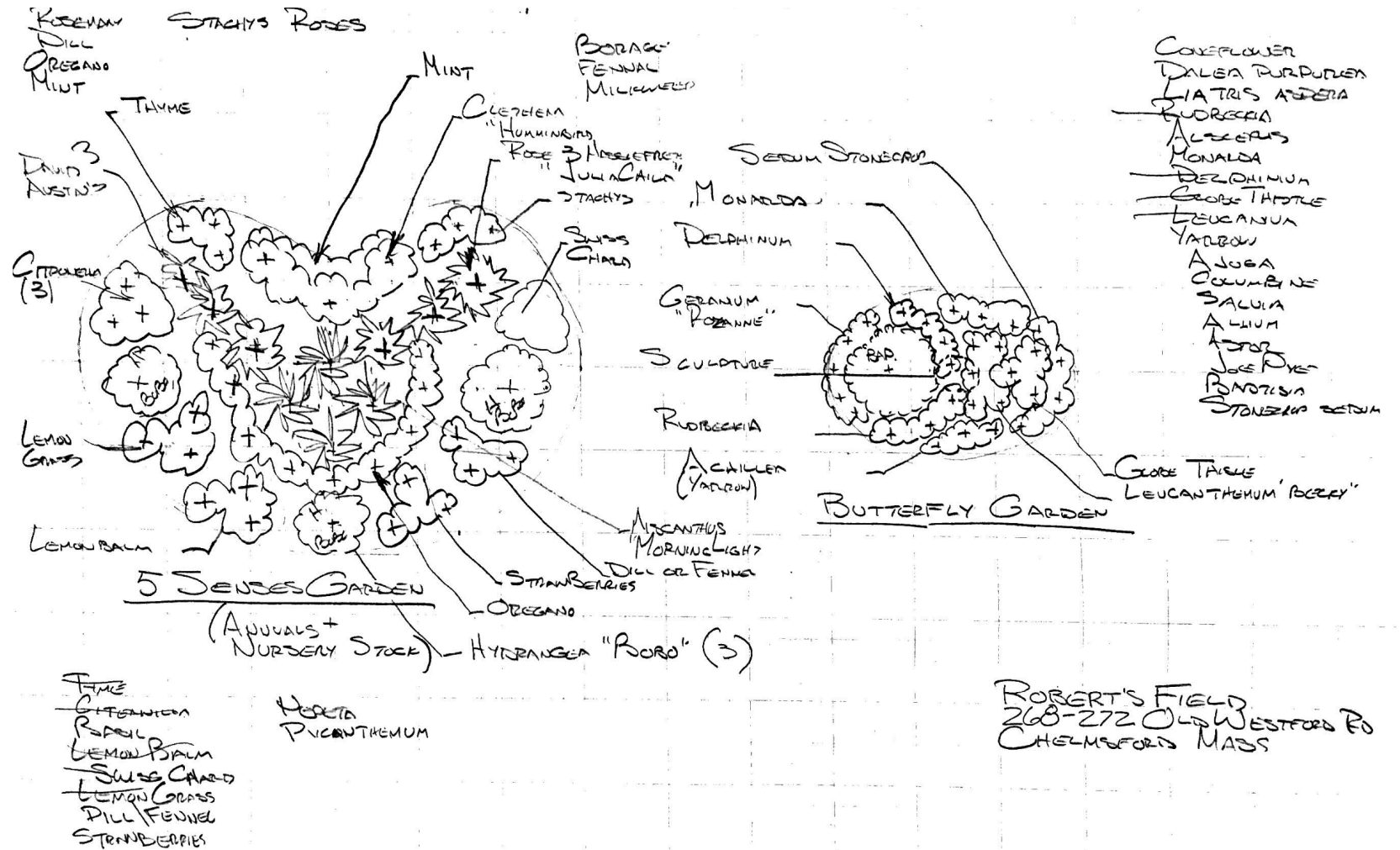

THE HISTORY OF
FRIENDSHIP PARK AT ROBERTS FIELD

FRIENDSHIP PARK NAMED BY THE COMMUNITY AS A GREAT PLACE FOR KIDS TO MAKE FRIENDS

pre1970's

The property was part of a king's grant to the Spalding family back in the early 1700s that was divided among their children. In the late 1960s the Town purchased "Robert's Land at Old Westford", which was moved elsewhere. In 1970, a Special Town Meeting voted to build the West Chelmsford Engine 3 Fire Station and to designate the remaining area for recreational purposes.

1973

The first playground at Roberts Field was gifted to the Town by the Parents for Adequate Recreation for Children (PARC) organization. The metal playground featured a tall clown themed structure with slides, a climbing dome, swings, and a toddler area created by the Chelmsford Garden Club. The playground was funded through donations from Chelmsford businesses and civic organizations.

1995

The Friends of the Park worked with the Town to build a new playground using large wooden, steel, and plastic structures. These included slides, swings, climbing areas, a sandbox, and a wooden car. An engraved brick pathway and stone marker featured donor names. The community named the playground Friendship Park because it sounded like a great place for kids to make friends.

2018

Today's inclusive, nature themed playground was built in a community driven design and build process by Town residents and the DPW. It was funded with CPA funds, sponsorships, and donations. The Friends of Roberts Field were charged with fundraising. In keeping with tradition, the engraved brick pathway and donor plaque and stone marker were added.

Pollinator Park borders the wetlands, and attracts and provides refuge for bees, butterflies, and other important pollinators. The walking trail winds through the wetlands and woodlands, which is habitat for squirrels, deer, rabbits, owls, hawks, turkeys, frogs, snakes, turtles and occasionally bears and bobcats. Please be respectful to wildlife; give them space and only leave your footprints.

Pollinator Park was established in 2015 as part of the wildlife sanctuary at Roberts Field. It is a certified wildlife habitat, recognized by the National Wildlife Federation for providing food, water and habitat to area wildlife.

Pollinator Park features over 50 varieties of native flowering and fruiting plants and shrubs, a wildlife and forager garden, a shade garden, a natural flowering meadow, a grassy area, and a picnic table.

The Wildlife Sanctuary follows a habitat and trail maintenance plan designed to preserve, restore, and enhance the natural areas of the park, including the pond, wetlands, forested areas, and Pollinator Park.

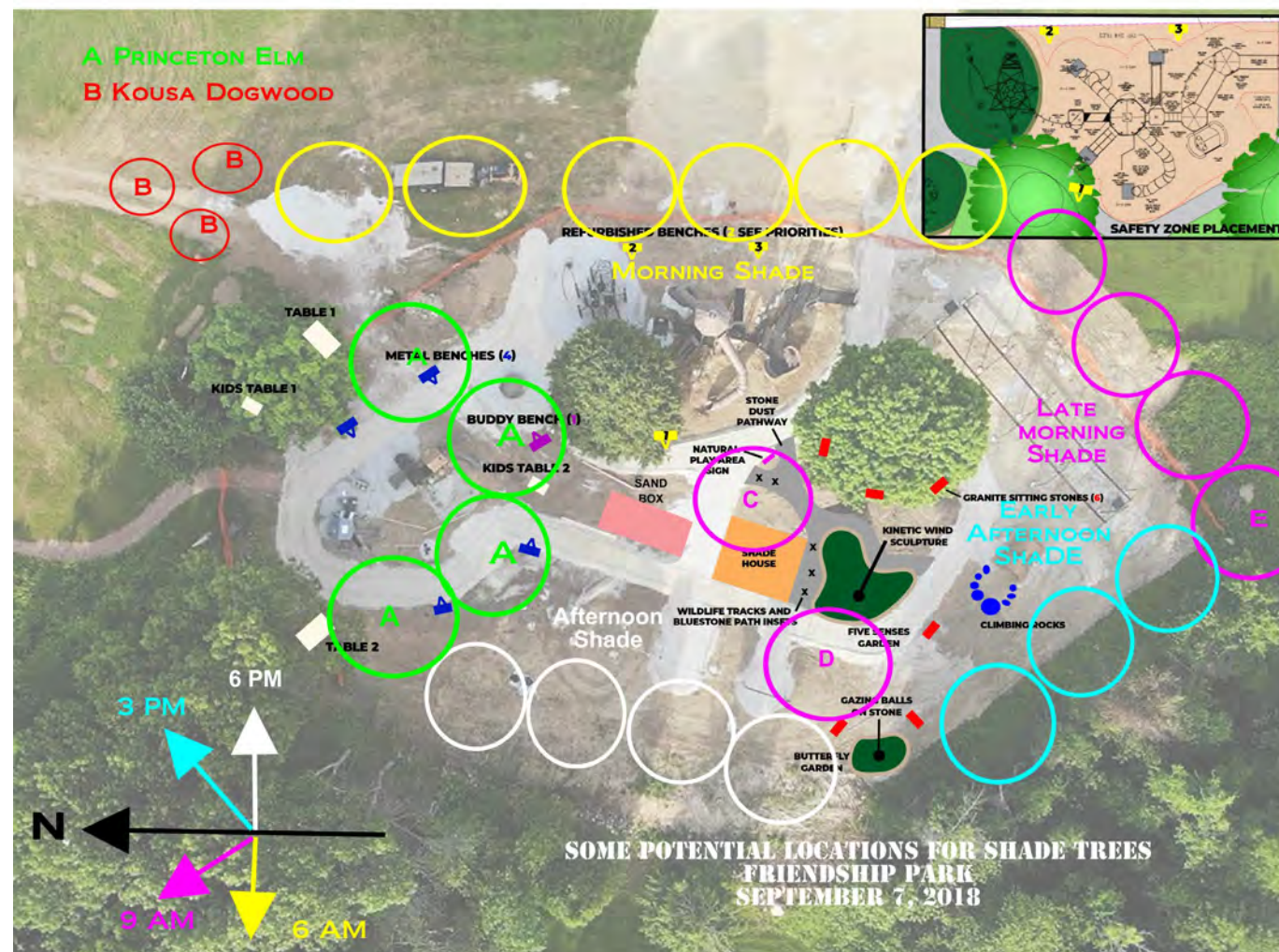
The Wildlife Sanctuary provides safe access to experience the natural areas, while conserving the habitat of the resident wildlife.
