ROBERTS FIELD

- Jim mentioned seeding the grassy area around the tree in the Natural Play Area during our meeting. Is this something that can be done while the playground is closed?
- Can you send over the list of exercise equipment you referenced in your last email?
- The committee would like to know if the Irrigation vendor has been selected yet or if there will be and RFP process. if a vendor has been selected can you please share with me who that is? if there will be an RFP process can you provide me with a copy of the RFP?
- Jim is very concerned about the trees. If we are not able to use much to protect the roots what alternative ideas do you have? Would it be possible to add mulch if we put a sign on the tree stating it was not play equipment?
- Bill asked if we could have the old seating from the T-ball field removed. Adele shared that it's an attractive nuisance.
- Can you include the Pond Side Pavilion on the phase 2 layout?
- Do you know if there are any plans to expand Engine #3 which would impede the hardscape play area planned for phase 2?





- 20' x 28' Multi-use Pavilion with three removable picnic table picnic/seating area, winter skate seating, and performance area for small bands or theatre performances. Replace three pond side benches. (\$19k-\$30k)

  - Includes electricity and interior lighting (timer/switch in garage)
  - · (4) picnic tables
  - No walls
  - Consistent Park wooden structure style
    - · Minimal visual obstruction
  - · 4 pond side sitting stone benches
  - Nearby garbage can
  - ADA compliant connecting path to walking path
  - · To be built when funds and DPW are available







## Friendship Park Sandbox Improvement

**Problem:** The issue is not the water level; it is the sand level. Putting in better drainage is a complex and expensive action that will not alleviate the issue. The water actually dissipates adequately today. The proper corrective action is to elevate the sand platform so that the play area is well above the water table.


#### **Solution Constraints:**

- The modified sandbox needs to remain ADA compliant, which means that it must properly serve anyone with special needs. Specifically, the sand surface and diggers must remain as accessible as they are now.
- The modified sandbox cannot introduce any hazards such as falling, wood splinters, or exposure to hazardous substances (e.g., pressure treating chemicals).
- The modified sandbox needs to minimize sand spillage to surrounding walkways.
- The corrective steps need to be cost effective. This includes minimal changes to the surrounding areas including walkways and hardscape surfaces.
